
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INTRODUCTION

This Is Your Journey

Welcome to the Discipleship Assessment Journey! This journey is for anyone desiring a closer relationship with God. This journey is for you, a disciple and follower of the Lord Jesus Christ.

The word used in the New Testament for disciple means "learner or follower." Jesus' method of making disciples differed radically from other cultures of His time. Greek culture deposited information and expected people to change. But Jesus, true to the Hebrew method of the rabbis, lived life alongside His disciples and taught them by example. This is our model: living like Christ in community as He forms us by His Spirit into Spirit-led, lifelong learners and followers of Jesus.

The Holy Spirit is the Teacher. He forms the character of Christ in believers and helps them to lead others in that same character-transformation process. All Spirit-empowered followers of Christ are called to grow in certain dimensions of living that will deepen their relationship with Jesus and strengthen their effectiveness in making other disciples. The following essential dimensions will be examined on this assessment journey: Bible, Holy Spirit, Mission, Prayer, Worship, Service, and Generosity. As you grow in each of these, your spiritual life will be stronger and your walk with God will not only be sustainable, but victorious!

How to Use This Journal


On the following pages, you'll be invited to evaluate your interaction with each of the seven dimensions. Based on your responses to questions about living out each dimension as a disciple, you will choose which dimension you want to address first. Turn to the pages in this journal which cover that dimension and follow along to Identify, Reflect, and Act on that dimension. You may engage with the questions and journal your progress.

HOW LONG DO I SPEND ON EACH DIMENSION?

That's up to you. If you are going through this with a group, discuss it with your group leader. Remember that discipleship is about *being* more than *doing*. If you spend a week or a month on each dimension, allow the Holy Spirit to have His way. There is no recommended amount of time and no prize for covering all dimensions quickly. Your walk with Jesus is a lifelong process of continual reevaluation.

DO I NEED TO COVER EACH DIMENSION?

You can eventually cover all seven, but there's no rush. Proceed at your pace or at the pace agreed upon by your group if you're using this journal in a small group setting. Remember that the habits are not ends in themselves. This journey is about aligning your spirit with God's Spirit, so this is for the rest of your life.



OVERVIEW

An Overview of This Framework

A Spirit-empowered disciple is a lifelong follower who is committed to a journey of becoming like Jesus. The Holy Spirit is the One who disciples believers. He forms the character of Christ in them and helps disciples reproduce themselves by leading others in that same character formation process. Disciples don't progress by leaving one dimension behind to embrace another, but rather they engage with all dimensions, outcomes, and practices at every stage of life on a holistic journey of discipleship.

Dimensions BIBLE

Disciples love and understand God's Big Story, and are able to interpret and apply God's Word well.

- Preschool children know the Bible is God's gift.
- Older children begin reading and memorizing the Bible.
- Young adults see the Big Story and know their place in God's plan.
- All adults are learning to interpret and apply God's Word wisely.

HOLY SPIRIT

Disciples are truly born again, experience the empowering, leading, and purifying work of the Spirit, and fervently seek the baptism in the Holy Spirit.

- Little ones learn to feel God's presence.
- Children are invited to respond to the Spirit and welcome Jesus as Lord.
- Children, youth, and adults are baptized in the Spirit, speak in tongues, and know they are in a process of sanctification and being empowered for mission.

MISSION

Disciples are on a mission with God in all areas of their life and can share the gospel and disciple new believers.

- The youngest followers begin learning that God has a plan.
- Older children learn the gospel and how to share their faith story.
- Youth and adults understand that their daily work lives are God's assignments and they look for divine appointments. They are able to lead someone to Christ and offer initial mentoring.

PRAYER

Disciples enjoy listening to and speaking with God, growing deeper in intimacy and intercession, fasting, and crying out for the glory of God.

- Preschoolers are learning that Jesus hears them when they pray.
- Older children learn the practice of daily prayer and begin understanding how God speaks to their spirit.
- Youth and adults delight in conversation and intercession, and understand that their prayers make a difference in the world.

WORSHIP

Disciples delight in God and offer all their life as worship to Him. Both personal intimacy with God and corporate worship are important for growth.

- · Little ones enjoy praising God.
- Older children enjoy singing and offer their chores and schoolwork to God as worship.
- Youth and adults understand worship and work are woven together (Romans 12:1-2; Colossians 3:17-23).

SERVICE

Disciples see all of life as a thank-you for God's grace and aim for a humble life of service to God and for others.

- Young children learn the joy of helping and how their tasks please God.
- Children learn that all good work is service and begin helping in the church and community.
- Youth and adults offer all their daily work as service and willingly volunteer as part of their local church.

GENEROSITY

Disciples respond to God's lavish grace by submitting all their resources to God and responding to the Holy Spirit's leading in giving and stewardship.

- Preschoolers begin learning that their giving matters and connect it with God's mission.
- Older children start learning about tithing and giving, which includes giving their time to serve.
- Youth and adults are maturing not only in financial generosity (tithing and giving), but also display generosity in the use of their time and talent.

Introduction

There's just no other resource as important as the Bible! That's because no book in history compares with the impact the Bible can make in a person's life. Unlike anything else written or recorded, the Bible carries the power of transformation. It is God's Word, so it is God-breathed. God's Spirit uses it as the primary tool of revelation for humankind and as a defensive spiritual weapon against the schemes of the devil. Different from a person's insight or advice, God's Word reveals who He is, what He wants, and teaches us how to grow closer in our relationship to God the Father, Son, and Spirit.

Every time you read the Bible, you can hear from God in a new way. So letting God speak to you through His Word daily helps you to become strong and grow spiritually. A committed disciple pursues this.

How to Proceed

In the Identify section below are the same statements you'll find in the Choosing a Dimension section. Read through each of them to refresh your memory and then move on to the Reflect section, which will help unpack each statement for you. Journal your thoughts in the space provided. Then in the Act section, commit to one of the action steps.

Identify

Reflect

You may come back to the other questions later when you revisit this dimension or stay to complete each one if you feel led to.

Act The Word of God is the starting point for taking action on every dimension of discipleship. Here are some practical guidelines to help you grow in your relationship with God and the Bible.

Start each day with a portion of Scripture (a verse or several verses). Write it somewhere you will see throughout the day, even on your phone, and consider what God is saying to you. If you are a new believer, start with either the Gospel of Mark or John, the letter to the Romans, or use our free Bible Engagement Project app to read daily.

Consider writing out the pressing questions you face in life, as well as your questions about the Bible. Start to journal, if you don't already do so. Then engage with the Bible: Where does it speak to these situations? Ask a pastor, mentor, or other Christian leader to help you find biblical principles that speak to your situations or refer to the Bible Engagement Project app.

Implement the SOAP process into the time you spend in the Bible

S Scripture Read the passage in your head, aloud, or both.

O Observation What details do you notice?

What is going on in this passage?

A Application How does this passage apply to your life today?

P Prayer Ask the Holy Spirit to help you live out the truth of this passage.

Identify people in one or more of the following areas family, church, friends, or coworkers—with whom you can share questions and findings about the Bible. Start or join a Bible study or make biblical topics more normal in everyday conversation. Reach out to at least one of these people this month to get the conversation started.
