introduction

Audacious faith is not reckless, arrogant, or unwise, but bold and daring, ready to take God at His word. Such faith waits in expectation of the miracles to come—trusting in the Lord's timing while experiencing His peace in the waiting. Audacious faith requires us to surrender our will to the will of God when things do not go as we planned.

Several years ago, my husband and I were lead pastors of a wonderful church in San Jacinto, California. The facility was comprised of several buildings including a children and youth center, an industrial kitchen, a fellowship hall, offices, and the main sanctuary. Instead of a keychain with dozens of different keys for every door, closet, cupboard, and file cabinet, keys were cut according to the access needed for each staff member. A small group had a special master key giving them open access to the entire property.

In many ways, faith is like a master key, allowing us access and entry into an abundant life with Jesus. Humankind may try to complicate the relationship and benefits that Jesus offers to us, but He has always kept it simple. Faith allows us to enter into a relationship with Jesus and pleases God greatly.

So, what does faith in everyday life really look like? What happens when we feel our faith is low or missing altogether? What do we do with disappointment or doubts in an outcome that we were believing for? Is it possible to grow our faith and take God at His word?

[Jesus said,] "With God everything is possible." Matthew 19:26

Over the next six weeks, we will define what biblical faith is, address the questions head-on, and discuss what it means to have audacious faith.

I believe that God is raising up an army of committed, passionate, Bible-based, Spirit-empowered women who are standing in faith and believing God for the impossible. What does such a woman look like? She is patient but not passive. She is tenacious, gracious, and against all odds trusting in the One whom she loves and serves. She is leaning into Jesus, and actively waiting with hope-filled expectation that God hears, knows, cares, and will always bring the answer.

WEEK 1-DAY 1 what is faith?

As we launch into our study about faith, there is no better place to begin than Hebrews 11. It is widely referred to as the "faith chapter" or the "hall of faith" as it reveals how centuries of God's people lived out their faith.

Faith is the center point of our spiritual journey, yet it can be challenging to define what it is. Verse 1 is a strong place to start:

Now faith is the substance of things hoped for, the evidence of things not seen.

Hebrews 11:1 (NKJV)

Faith is not something we can visibly see, but we do see the effects of it lived out in our daily life. Faith and hope that are aligned with Scripture result in substance and evidence—proof that we are believing and trusting in God.

The word for faith in the Greek language is *pistis*. It's related to the ideas of belief, assurance, and conviction based on the faithfulness and trustworthiness of God. Faith can produce confidence, knowing that trust in God is not merely wishful thinking, but anchored to His promises and yet, surrendered to His sovereignty.

If there is one important place for us to focus as we begin our study, it would be verse 6:

And it is impossible to please God without faith. Anyone who wants to come to him must believe that God exists and that he rewards those who sincerely seek him.

Hebrews 11:6

I don't think it could be said more plainly. Your faith pleases God! He sees how you are trusting Him and there is great reward in doing so.

Throughout your life, there will be many seasons of your faith journey—times of growth and stretching, times of standing and believing, times of seeing and celebrating, and even times of questioning and doubting. Hebrews 11 is replete with the names of the most famous Old Testament believers who walked through impossibilities and uncertainty just like you can. And each one is introduced with the reason for their inclusion: By faith Abel, by faith Noah, by faith Abraham, by faith Sarah, Moses, Rahab, and many more believed God.

May you live a life marked by faith and utter dependence on God so that your name will be added to the numerous faithful who bring glory to Him.

As you look over the list of names in Hebrews 11, you can either be motivated or intimidated. List what motivates and encourages you.
Verses 1–35 record the results of trusting in God. However, verses 35–38 list those who believed yet did not receive what they asked for. But they still made it into the "hall of faith." What does that say about their faith?
