He would ask what was so wrong with pursuing, expressing and sharing something that could have saved his life because he now sees there was

more to life than what he could

If the dead man could speak, he would probably ask you if all that money you saved for yourself was worth it? Was it worth denying a boy in Ukraine the opportunity to hear that there was a man who died for him because a girl could never get on a plane because you never gave? If you think saving that money was worth it, then tell it to the face of a dead man. Tell it to the face of a dead man who never had a chance to experience life, heaven or eternity. What were you saving that money for? The design for your casket?

We all die. Every great man and woman dies. We live in a very fallible world. We all will die. That is just a fact of life.

But there is something bigger than life. There is something bigger than the physical, and you had the answer the entire time. You looked the dead man in the face and said nothing. Now, knowing that you could have given him something far greater than the cure to cancer (not just prayer for physical healing but also speaking an eternal miracle into his life), you wonder, What if I had said something? What if I had broken the silence?

Maybe then the dead man's speech would have been a little different.

If the dead man could speak, he would probably look you in the face and ask you why you never talked to him. He would ask how you could have walked into his life and never spoken about this love. If the dead man could speak, he would probably ask if you thought you were being kind by lying to his face about the future and never allowing him the opportunity to choose Christ.

# My Life is Meaningless Repetition.

Every morning at six, I wake up with a hangover. I remedy that with a swig of vodka leftover from the night before, pick up some clothes off the floor, get dressed, and walk to the bus stop a few blocks away. Then I wait in the bitter Russian cold to get to work.

I arrive at a job that I hate, a job in which I perform the bare minimum. My boss screams at me, again, for what I didn't finish the day before. I don't respond. I have to keep this job. The economy here is just as harsh as the winter. Every day I walk down the street and see the same thing—a poorly clothed child with her mom begging at local shops. Plus I need the job to buy my next bottle of booze.

Finally it arrives. Five o'clock. I'm off the clock. I walk to the nearby liquor store. I look around as though I might buy something different this time but it's always the same—Kvass and vodka—and I take my walk of shame to the counter to pay.

Thirty minutes later I'm home. I pour my first drink and turn on the news. Like every other day, the news is the same—terrorist attacks. Five hundred dead in Pakistan, another thousand in Afghanistan, and 100 in some other country nearby. Those poor people—dead people. Sometimes I think they have it better. They have escaped the endless routine, the endless cycle. I could join them. I could end it all here and now. It would be so easy.

If I end it, what will I see? Who will I meet? God? I'm told I was baptized in the church as a baby to "save my soul." Was that enough? I don't know. I don't feel like my soul has much to save. I'm a mess of endless, hopeless repetition. The days are filled with the same news, the same tragedy, the same pathetic life. God couldn't possibly be paying attention to what goes on down here. And even if He is, He wouldn't have time for me.





# I Am Valued and Prized.

I am the apple of my father's eye. My mother and brothers love me—one day I hope to have a husband that loves me, too. Sophisticated, educated, modern—these words describe me perfectly. My connections and my university degree landed me a very good job with the Sheik's family—and it pays more than enough for my favorite Chanel bracelets, Godiva chocolates and Louis Vuitton handbags. I have everything I need, every luxury of life at my fingertips. I feel safe, secure, and accomplished.

While I am certain of many things in my life, my day of judgment is one thing I am not certain of. There is just no way of knowing. There is no certain answer to the question of eternal life. There is no assurance of heaven. It is my Allah's decision. He is transcendent and unknowable. He is aloof, set apart, and unreachable. His greatness is far beyond

any thought I can have of him. He knows all things but cannot be known. He never forgets and never makes a mistake. If he wants me to be holy, I will be holy.

I'm told and believe that it will be well in the end if I live my life with modesty and practice good deeds. These are the tasks ahead of me. Beyond them, there is no certainty because I cannot tell what Allah thinks about me. I just know he keeps a tally of my good words and my good deeds and at judgment he will weigh them all on a balance scale. If the scale tips in my favor, Allah will judge me rightly. I will pass his judgment. If not... I do not know how it will all turn out.

It sounds harsh but as long as the count is in my favor, I should be okay. Yes, I should be okay, and I will earn a place in paradise after I die.

## Abiding

**Extravagant daily time with Jesus—this is the center of abiding.** Not legalism, not dry discipline, not manufactured spirituality, but joyous soaking in the presence of Jesus, lavish spending of time with Him who is most precious, Him from whom all life flows. In a world that is overconnected yet lonely, frantically busy yet accomplishing little of eternal value, superinformed but egregiously ignorant on what really matters, abiding is a call to give Jesus the best of our time that He in turn leads us to the best of times. The Greek word for abiding (*meno*) is connected to the Latin *maneo*—meaning “house.” From it we derive the English word “mansion.” Abiding means to remain in one place, at a given time, with someone, to dwell with someone. In his Gospel John uses *meno* to express a reciprocal indwelling: **We are in Jesus and Jesus is in us.** We linger in Him and He lingers in us. We live in Him and He lives in us. He is the source of life, He is the sap, and this interaction is both constant and with special times of union. **It is both the journey and the destination.** Abiding is elongated, patient waiting in the presence of Jesus. Abiding is extravagant (concentrated) daily times with Jesus and all-day awareness. Abiding is constant communion in the midst of a crowded world and busy life and unique times of sweet, exclusive fellowship. Abiding implies extravagance. When John uses *meno*, there is always a sense of endurance, continuance, tarrying and waiting with expectancy over time. **Abiding is both active and passive.** Abiding is passive in the sense that Jesus pursues us and invites us to rest in His presence. Abiding is active in the reality that the spiritual disciplines position us to receive the life of Jesus—His heavenly sap. Discipline leads us to desire, which matures into delight. Men and women of God through the centuries have lived out this abiding truth. **There are no heroes of the faith who did not live out this extravagant lavishing of their time on Jesus.** When we examine their private lives, we see that they needed to abide for strength and wisdom. They were addicted to extravagant time in the presence of Jesus because it gave them life and joy. It was the only thing that fulfilled them. This sounds like an impossibility in our modern culture, however, there are those who have charted the course for us. Mary Slessor was a fire-filled Scottish redhead accustomed to fighting thugs in Dundee with her fists. She went to Africa and fought slave traders and baby killers, giving her life to the Calabar people and fighting for the rights of Africa women. Mary cultivated a lifelong habit of chatting with her heavenly Father out loud and incessantly. It was Slessor who coined the phrase **“God plus one are always a majority.”** Live in the new majority.

He signed the decree, and I went straight to my room. I dropped to my knees and looked out towards Jerusalem. I thought about the king, his men, and those lions, and I realized none of them are my enemies.

My greatest enemy is a voice inside me, saying, "Don't speak. Don't move." But I won't be silent. I won't retreat to fear. I can't afford to. Though my circumstances swirl around me and make the voice louder, I will put myself into the place of complete humility, into the place of complete devotion to God.

"You are the same God who delivered me from captivity and who clothed me in royal robes and put a gold chain around my neck. My devotion to the true King outweighs all fear within me. And it is for that reason, God, my heart overflows with gratitude towards you. I will not turn away from you," I declare.

Footsteps approach. My fellow governors catch me praying and giving thanks to my God. I broke their law—the law they knew I

would break—but I have no regrets. They lead me away as the king searches for a loophole to save me. None is found, and I find myself sealed in tight for the night.

My eyes adjust to the low light, and I see the lions circle. I hear a guttural noise from one, while a few others bare their teeth. But not one moves towards me. Then I see the angel, and it's clear: God has intervened. I sit and wait and watch these powerful animals move around, unable to follow their instincts. I look them in the face, overcome by the boldness looking back at me.

And suddenly I see myself in these lions that boldly face the world before them. The fear I had, now gone. The voice inside, silenced. There in the den of lions, I once again thank God. He saw me when I did not bend to my circumstance or give way to my fear. He saw me. He heard me. And now He provides for me. He makes a way for me to live another day, to walk from this cave and be His voice to this generation.

**OUR LIFE STORIES AND THE HISTORY OF THE WORLD ARE BEING WRITTEN THROUGH THE SAME HAND THAT WROTE THE STORY OF PHILIP THE EVANGELIST.**

As Saul's murderous persecution begins, Philip leaves Jerusalem and finds himself in the middle of a revival in Samaria (Acts 8:1-8). The people heard Philip preach and saw the signs, and there was much joy in the city. They believed the gospel and were baptized. In your life, the Spirit may place you in the midst of a similar awakening where, like Philip, you must refuse to trade the altar for the stage. Some of you will experience the limelight and applause of the crowds.

**STAY HUMBLE AND REMEMBER WHO IS RESPONSIBLE FOR YOUR SUCCESS.**

In Samaria Philip is enjoying the tangible presence of God when he hears the angel speak, and the angel tells him to go to the desert (Acts 8:26). Sometimes destiny knocks at inconvenient times but God's purpose is endless if we will

believe. You may become the catalyst to someone else's dream. Philip set the stage for Peter and John to come to Samaria and receive the credit. Philip steps aside and allows Peter and John to place their hands on believers to be Spirit-baptized. What is even greater than success is God's trust in you to give you influence to use for someone else's dream. It takes great faith to serve in this capacity and seldom be recognized.

**BUT WHEN WE AREN'T CONCERNED WITH WHO GETS THE CREDIT, THERE IS NO LIMIT TO WHAT GOD CAN DO.**

Philip left the stage in Samaria and found his altar in the middle of nowhere. And it is there, in the desert, that he hears the voice of the Spirit (Acts 8:29). The Spirit commands him to go out and be near the chariot where he finds the Ethiopian eunuch, a leader with immense wealth and influence. He is returning from a pilgrimage to the Temple in Jerusalem—a place laden with Spirit-filled first-century Christians—and has left still not knowing Christ. The Spirit fixes His gaze on this seeker and uses Philip to speak to him. The influential leader is converted and baptized. He will become the first Gentile

believer and according to church tradition the funnel for gospel expansion in Africa.

Like Philip from Samaria, God is luring this generation away from the crowds for a fresh expression of success and significance. Some of you may hear the Spirit speak in a word, an image, a mental story or a memory bringing you toward something unique, something distant and something not quite definable yet. This place is your desert.

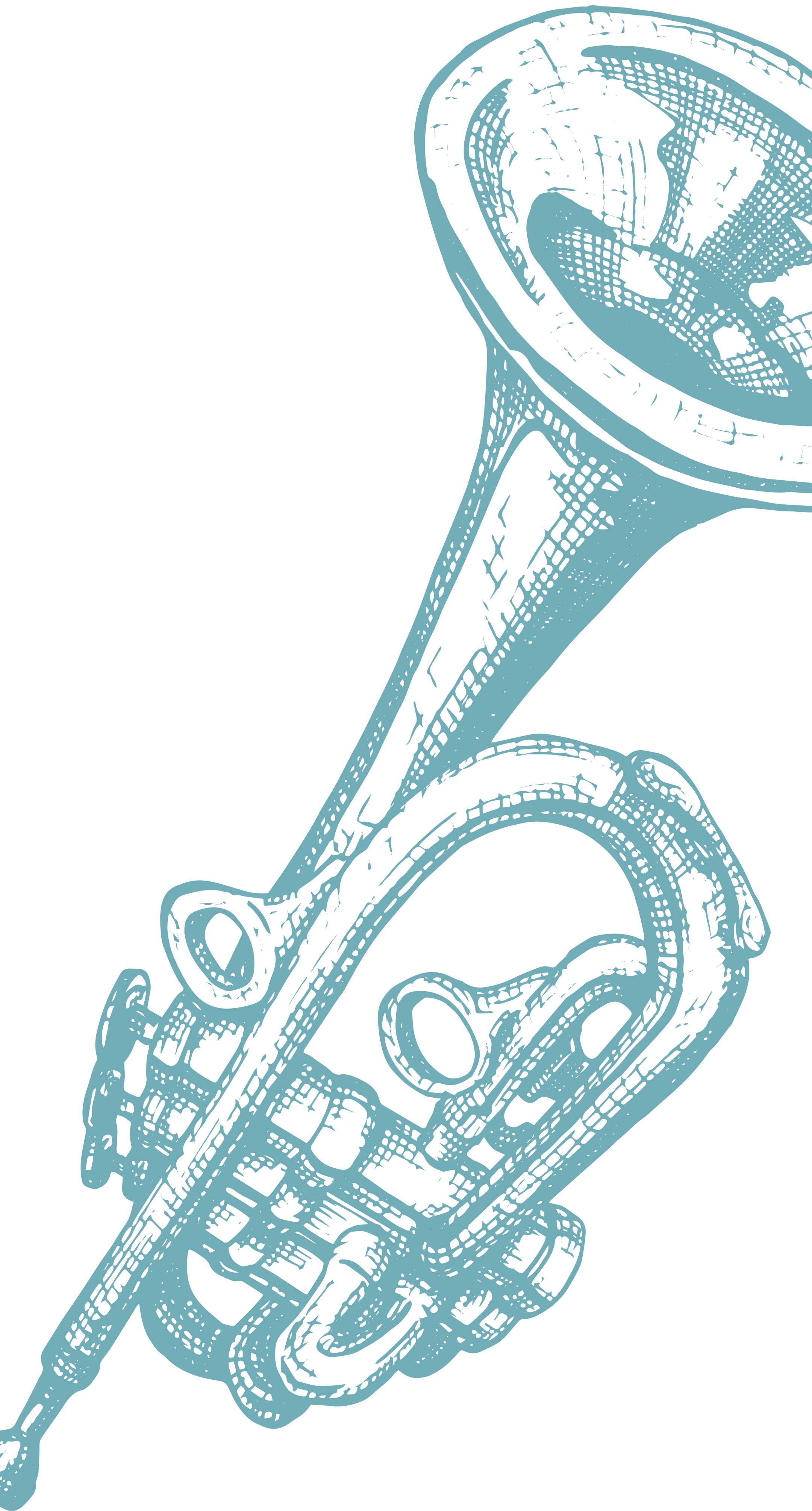

We must be content with whatever level of influence He gives us. It may look different in your life than it does anywhere else. That's okay. Regardless of where His voice takes you, there is a conversation happening right now in Heaven and your name is part of it. God is summoning us and the next generation to hear His Spirit speak.

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# Shape the Grace

Justice and rights are about getting what we deserve. But no one deserves to get grace. Not me, not you, and not the unreached person who has never heard the gospel. The whole point of grace is that you can't do anything good to earn it and nothing bad can disqualify you from it. Grace is God's gift to freely offer. "The wages of sin is death, but the free gift of God is eternal life through Christ Jesus" (Romans 6:23). This means we have to be careful when we talk about the injustice that 40 percent of people today live with little or no access to the good news of God's grace through Jesus Christ. That is a great injustice. But it's not just that sinners aren't hearing about Jesus, or even that God owes them grace. The greatest injustice is that the people who have heard the Good News are not sharing this with everyone around them. Do you wake up every day convinced that you are a sinner, that "no one is righteous, not even one" (Romans 3:10)? Convinced that God has every right to give us the payment, or "wages," for our sin, and convinced that something shockingly wonderful has happened instead? Convinced that God put the payment for your sin onto Jesus rather than you, and convinced that God did this, not because of anything good you have done, but in spite of the really terrible things you have done? Then tell somebody about it! This is really good news! And when you look especially for people in unreached places who have never heard the gospel, and you do whatever it takes to share the gospel with them, you help to prove that God's grace is free to them regardless of where they live. Nothing can make anyone deserve grace any more or any less.

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## LILLIAN TRASHER KNELT IN THE WOODS AND SAID, "LORD, I WANT TO BE YOUR LITTLE GIRL."

WHEN LILLIAN TURNED 22, SHE FELL IN LOVE WITH A YOUNG PASTOR, TOM JORDAN. BUT 10 DAYS BEFORE THE WEDDING, SHE HEARD A MISSIONARY FROM INDIA SPEAK AND GOD CALLED HER TO BE A MISSIONARY. AFTER A TEARFUL NIGHT IN PRAYER, SHE DECIDED SHE COULD NOT MARRY TOM. "GOD HAS CALLED ME TO BE A FOREIGN MISSIONARY, AND I CAN'T REFUSE HIM," SHE TOLD TOM WHO REPLIED THAT HE WOULD WAIT FOR HER. SHE INSISTED HE COULD NOT, FOR HER CALLING COULD TAKE DECADES.

ON OCT. 8, 1910, SHE AND HER SISTER JENNIE SET SAIL FOR EGYPT. LILLIAN ARRIVED IN ASSIUT AND IMMEDIATELY RESPONDED TO THE NEEDS OF ORPHANS. A BABY WHOSE MOTHER DIED AND FATHER WOULD HAVE THROWN IT INTO THE NILE RIVER WAS BROUGHT TO HER HOST HOME. SHE ACCEPTED RESPONSIBILITY FOR THE MALNOURISHED BABY AND RENTED A ROOM—IT WAS THE BIRTH OF AN ORPHANAGE. LILLIAN NEVER TURNED ANYONE AWAY AND BY THE 1960S THE ORPHANAGE HAD 11 BUILDINGS AND WAS HOME TO 1,500 CHILDREN.

LILLIAN TOLD A FAVORITE STORY THAT SOUNDED MUCH LIKE HER LIFE:

MY WORK REMINDS ME OF A FABLE OF A LITTLE BOY WHO WAS CROSSING THE DESERT ALONE. HE BECAME VERY THIRSTY SO HE WAS OBLIGED TO DIG IN THE GROUND WITH BLEEDING FINGERS UNTIL HE CAME TO WATER. HE DRANK AND WENT ON HIS WEARY WAY. EACH TIME HE BECAME THIRSTY HE DUG HOLES AND HIS HANDS BECAME MORE TORN AND BLEEDING. AT LAST HE REACHED THE OTHER SIDE, EXHAUSTED AND FAINTING, HIS CLOTHES HANGING IN DUSTY RAGS.

SOME MONTHS LATER HE LOOKED ACROSS THE DESERT AND SAW A HAPPY LITTLE BOY COMING WITH HIS HANDS FULL OF FRESH FLOWERS. THE CHILD WAS COMING THE VERY SAME WAY WHICH HE HAD TRAVELED. HE LOOKED AT THE STRANGE SIGHT IN PERFECT AMAZEMENT. WHEN THE LITTLE BOY ARRIVED, HE ASKED HIM HOW IT COULD BE THAT HE HAD CROSSED THE AWFUL DESERT AND LOOKED SO FRESH AND COOL. THE CHILD ANSWERED, SAYING, "OH, THE WAY IS BEAUTIFUL. THERE ARE MANY SMALL WELLS OUT OF WHICH SPRING LOVELY, COOL WATER, AND AROUND EACH OF THESE WELLS THERE ARE FLOWERS AND SHADY BUSHES AND SOFT GREEN GRASS. I HAD NO TROUBLE AT ALL IN CROSSING!"

THE FIRST BOY LOOKED DOWN AT HIS OWN SCARRED FINGERS AND KNEW THAT IT WAS HIS SUFFERING WHICH HAD MADE THE DESERT BLOOM AND HAD MADE THE WAY EASY FOR OTHER LITTLE BOYS TO CROSS. BUT NO ONE WOULD EVER KNOW TO THANK HIM OR TO ASK WHO HAD DUG THE WELLS, BUT HE KNEW AND WAS SATISFIED.

## Justice, Injustice, & Jesus

I usually define injustice as “when things don’t go my way.” A referee makes a bad call against my favorite team; a person in the “seven items or less” grocery line has 12 items; or a friend says something hurtful behind my back. In each of these situations, my heart cries out, “Injustice!”

The Bible invites us to consider that injustice is not simply what happens when others don’t live as we desire. Injustice is what happens when we don’t live as God desires.

In Genesis 3, the story of a loving Creator is interrupted by the rebellion of His creation. Brokenness invades the wholeness of God’s creation and injustice arrives on the scene. Look at what happens in just Genesis 3 and 4:

· Adam turns on Eve: the injustice of blame shifting.

· They are forced to leave the garden: the injustice of exile.

· Cain kills Abel: the injustice of murder.

· Lamech marries two women: the injustice of dehumanizing others.

· Lamech kills a young man and brags about it: the injustice of the strong exploiting the weak.

Throughout the Old Testament there are many stories of horrific injustice. But hope appears: God loves justice (Psalm 11:7), and He will do whatever necessary to retell the story and reshape our hearts. Injustice will not have the final say. God inserts Himself into the story and Jesus announces a Kingdom remarkably different than those governed by power and force.

Jesus gave the people glimpses of the eventual restoration of everything through healings

and miracles. He shared meals with outcasts, embracing the ones rejected by those in political and religious power. But how did Jesus ultimately defeat injustice? He did it by allowing Himself to be swallowed up by both injustice and justice.

On the cross, Jesus suffered unthinkable injustice at the hands of humankind and unavoidable justice at the hand of God. What does that mean?

Jesus committed no crime, but under the cover of darkness and at the hands of insecure politicians and a riled-up mob, Jesus endured unthinkable injustice.

But Jesus also encountered the unavoidable justice of God. We could not make ourselves right (or just) before God. Jesus provided the required perfection with His life

and the required payment with His death. On the cross, the wrath of God was justly poured out on Him so that the love of God could be justly poured out on you and me. Jesus suffered injustice and took the blow of justice that we deserved so that we could be healed and made whole—so that we could be justified.

Yes, Jesus cares about human rights and as His people we should declare hope into hopeless situations and demonstrate true justice. But Jesus also cares about “right” humans; He came to make The Human Right. The story has changed and now we get to live out that story. We get to join the mission of announcing that the Kingdom has come and is coming.
